

ERAU GRABS HIGHEST FINISH EVER IN NCAA DIVISION II LEARFIELD DIRECTORS' CUP; PLACES 26TH WITH 472 POINTS IN 2021-22

CLEVELAND, Ohio – NCAA Division II postseason appearances by 11 different programs (men's basketball, men and women's cross country, men's golf, women's rowing, softball, women's soccer, men's tennis, men and women's track and field, and volleyball) during 2021-22 season aided Embry-Riddle in recording the Eagles' best finish in the LEARFIELD Directors' Cup since becoming a full Division II member back in 2017.

Embry-Riddle earned 472 total points to slot in 26th out of 306 Division II schools in the standings, a mark 64 spots higher than the previous best result of 90th back in 2017-18. Additionally, the Eagles accumulated the third-most points out of the 11 Sunshine State Conference members.

The LEARFIELD Directors' Cup honors institutions in all three NCAA divisions, as well as the NAIA, that achieve success in a multitude of sports. For Division II, only scores from the top 15 programs are counted, although men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball and volleyball must be included. Programs receive points based on where they finish in the national postseason tournament.



ERAU ATHLETICS PLACES FIFTH-MOST STUDENT-ATHLETES ON 2021-22 D2 ADA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT LIST

CLEVELAND, Ohio – A record 215 Embry-Riddle student-athletes received the 2021-22 Division 2 Athletics Directors Association Academic Achievement Award, the fifth-most from any institution and more than any other Sunshine State Conference member. This is an increase of 85 after the Eagles had 130 meet the qualifications last year.

In order for a student-athlete to receive an Academic Achievement Award, he/she must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, have attended a minimum of two years (four semesters) of college level work, and have been an active member of an intercollegiate team during his/her last academic year.



FELPS-DARLEY RECEIVES DIVISION II EXCELLENCE AWARD

CLEVELAND, Ohio – Embry-Riddle's Director of Compliance <u>Mea Felps-Darley</u> was named the 2022 Division II Excellence Award winner by the National Association for Athletic Compliance on Tuesday. The Division II Excellence Award is a prestigious annual award given to a compliance professional who is a leader in the compliance field at the Division II level.

"I'm extremely grateful to be recognized for this award," Felps-Darley said. "NCAA Compliance can be a tough job at times, but it can also be the most rewarding. Thank you to my peers in compliance and to NAAC for the honor of this award."

An alumnus of Embry-Riddle and the Eagles' cheerleading program, Felps-Darley returned to ERAU as the Athletics program's first director of compliance in 2014. In 2017, she was named Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance and was designated Senior Woman Administrator in 2021.



ERAU SPORTS MARKETING WINS MULTIPLE NACMA AWARDS

LAS VEGAS, Nev. – The 2021-22 Embry-Riddle Sports Marketing team collected eight awards at the 2022 "Best of" Awards Ceremony presented by the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators at the Mandalay Bay Resort. The ERAU Sports Marketing team of Director Mitch Van Sumeren, Assistant Director Emily Briske and interns Brennan Hale, Ethan Klohr and Kenzie Whiting won three golds, three silvers and two bronzes.



ORTIZ COUDER HONORED AS SSC SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

MELBOURNE, Fla. – Embry-Riddle men's tennis standout <u>Juan Ortiz Couder</u> added yet another honor to his impressive list of accolades on Tuesday when he was named the 2021-22 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year by the Sunshine State Conference.

Throughout his storied career, Ortiz Couder has epitomized the Eagles' Student-Person-Player mantra having excelled in the classroom and on the court, as well as giving back to the community. Additional years of competition gained due to COVID allowed the Madrid, Spain native to complete his undergraduate and master's degrees in Software Engineering and pursue a doctorate degree. After compiling a 3.78 GPA as an undergrad and a perfect 4.0 in the master's program, Ortiz Couder currently has a 4.0 in pursuit of his Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science.

Ortiz Couder has been named to the Sunshine State Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll and ITA Scholar-Athlete rosters five times each. He was a two-time Eagles of Excellence scholarship recipient and was awarded the 2017-18 Steve & Vicky Ridder scholarship. He was also named ERAU's Undergraduate Student of the Year in Software Engineering in 2019 and was the program's Graduate Student of the Year in 2021.

Ortiz Couder has also been active on campus and in the community. On campus, he was involved with the ERAU Tech Eagles, was the men's tennis representative on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, helped with campus showcases for prospective students and participated in campus clean-up activities. He was also the men's tennis team's Team Impact liaison, and volunteered with the Halifax Humane Society, hurricane preparation and clean-up, and a variety of tennis clinics for children, as well as Food Brings Hope and the Marine Science Center.

On the court, Ortiz Couder graduated as the most decorated student-athlete in ERAU men's tennis' NCAA II era. He finished the 2022 season ranked No. 5 nationally in singles play with a 21-5 ledger. In doubles, he was 19-9 overall and held the distinction of featuring in the national rankings twice with two different partners. He teamed up with <u>Andres Donayre</u> for a 10-3 ledger at the top doubles position and a No. 11 national ranking, while his partnership with <u>Luke Paschal</u> yielded a 6-3 record and a ranking of No. 38.

Ortiz Couder is the second Embry-Riddle student-athlete to win an SSC End-of-the-Year award since the Eagles became full members of the SSC in 2017-18, joining last year's winner Elijah Jenkins. Voting for the SSC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year is conducted among Athletic Directors, Senior Woman Administrators, Athletic Communication Directors, and Faculty Athletic Representatives from the 11 SSC member institutions.



BECKWITH, AGUSTSDOTTIR NOMINATED FOR NCAA WOMAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. – Seniors <u>Ukeyvia Beckwith</u> and <u>Anita Agustsdottir</u> have been nominated for the 2022 NCAA Woman of the Year Award, one of the most prestigious NCAA awards.

A standout on ERAU's cross country and track & field teams, Beckwith is one of the most decorated student-athlete in program history. A three-time All-American at 800m, she finished fourth at the 2022 NCAA Indoor National Championships and followed that with a third-place performance at outdoor nationals. Beckwith is a two-time Peach Belt Conference Track Athlete of the Year and has earned US Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association All-Region recognition 30 times. The PBC record holder in the high jump (1.71m), she is a four-time PBC champion in that event and won conference titles in the 800m, 400m and 4x400m relay at the 2022 PBC Championships.

Beckwith (Orlando, Fla.) completed her undergraduate degree in Aerospace and Occupational Safety with a 3.35 grade point average and has a 3.50 GPA in pursuit of her master's degree in Business Administration. A three-time Eagles of Excellence scholarship recipient, she was also the inaugural recipient of the Howard Walls Jr. Track & Field Memorial Scholarship and is spending the summer as a Safety and Security Intern Allegiant Airlines where Walls was the Director of Quality, Compliance and Safety-Stations.

The Orlando, Florida native is also active on campus and in the community. She is the women's track & field representative on ERAU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, was on the College of Aviation's Dean of Students Advisory Board and has served as president and vice president of the International Society of Air Safety Investigators. She also helps coach middle school runners and has volunteered as a pacer and course monitor at several local races.

Agustsdottir transferred to Embry-Riddle in 2019 and played virtually every minute of every game in her two seasons wearing the Blue and Gold. Hailing from Akranes, Iceland, Agustsdottir graduated with a 3.68 GPA in Human Factors Psychology in May. She was named to the Sunshine State Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll three times and was awarded an Eagles of Excellence scholarship in 2020-21.

On the field, Agustsdottir led the Eagles to back-to-back SSC tournament titles, as well as the 2021 regular season crown. Her performance on the Eagles' back line garnered SSC Defensive Player of the Year and SSC Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors in 2021. She was also D2CCA Third-Team All-American and was named to the United Soccer Coaches All-America Third Team.

Agustsdottir volunteered for several community events, including Me Strong 5K, the Tomoka Marathon and Food Brings Hope. She was also a Research Assistant for an FAA grant to examine aviation weather display interpretability and the implications for general aviation training.



WARD SIGNS WITH BLUE JAYS

TORONTO - The Toronto Blue Jays have inked Embry-Riddle Baseball's <u>Kelsey Ward</u> as an undrafted free agent following the 2022 MLB Draft. The left-hander out of Vero Beach, Florida wrapped up his second season with the Blue and Gold in the spring and has been starring for the Waynesboro Generals of the Valley League over the summer.

"We're really very proud of Kelsey and excited for him to begin the professional chapter of his baseball career," Head Coach <u>Randy Stegall</u> said. "He has worked very hard to put himself in this position. We are eager to follow his journey to the big leagues."

Ward appeared in 22 games with 18 starts over his two campaigns with the Eagles. His 98 strikeouts in 90.2 innings were the most on ERAU's staff during that span. At 6-2, 200 lbs., the hard-throwing lefty most recently was named an All-Star in the Valley League after posting phenomenal numbers in his seven starts. Ward posted a 5-0 mark with a 1.80 ERA and 31 Ks in 30.0 innings of work. Last summer, Ward became the first Embry-Riddle baseball player ever to play in the Cape Cod League.

"I'm beyond grateful and humbled by the opportunity to continue my athletic career with the Blue Jays organization," Ward said. "This next chapter is truly a dream come true that could not have been made feasible without the help of Coach Stegall, Coach Koronka, Coach Diaz, Coach (Chuck) Stegall, my awesome teammates, the athletic department, and my professors & academic advisor. I will always be proud to be an Eagle and appreciative of the University and program for believing in me and enabling me."

Ward becomes the <u>33rd Eagle</u> to either be drafted by or sign a contract with a MLB squad, and the first since Tyler Cyr and Zac Grotz in 2015. Two previous Blue and Gold pitchers have signed with the Blue Jays organization; Brian Letko was drafted in the 19th round of the 2007 Draft, and Tucker Jensen inked with Toronto as a free agent following his 2011 season with ERAU.



MEN'S SOCCER RECEIVES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – For the third consecutive season and 12th time in program history, the Embry-Riddle men's soccer team was tabbed as a United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award winner. The 27 student-athletes recorded a 3.53 team GPA during the 2021-22 academic year.
